The 102nd Meeting of the Retirement Allowance Committee was held on November 18, 1957, in the Secretary's Office, Room 746, in the Merchandise Mart and the following were in attendance:

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 10:30 A.M. On a motion by Mr. Meinardi, seconded by Mr. Johnson, the minutes of the 101st Meeting held October 21, 1957, were unanimously approved as written.

The announcement of deaths reported since the last meeting was made by the Secretary as per attached listing.

On a motion by Mr. McNamara, seconded by Mr. Burns, the 37 applications submitted by the Secretary, were unanimously approved as per attached listing. The disability application for Mr. P. Difino, Way and Structures Department, was submitted by the Secretary with a recommendation that the date of retirement be made retroactive to October 1, 1957. Mr. Difino has been absent from duty since March, 1957, because of an injury on duty. The Secretary advised the Committee that he had received replies from a number of departments regarding employes hired as temporary employes and subsequently made permanent employes. Mr. Meinardi advised the Committee that he felt the problem of temporary employes being transferred from a temporary status to a permanent status was an internal Chicago Transit Authority operating procedure and made a motion to rescind Rule No. 17 applying to temporary employes who were subsequently made permanent employes. This motion was seconded by Mr. McNamara and unanimously approved by the Committee. There being no further business, on a motion by Mr. Meinardi, seconded by Mr. Murray, the Committee unanimously agreed that the meeting be adjourned. The meeting adjourned at 11:00 A.M.
