The Chairman called the Meeting to order at 10:35 A.M.

On a motion by Mr. Meinardi, seconded by Mr. Flaherty, the minutes of the 219th Meeting held on August 21, 1967, were unanimously approved.

The announcement of deaths reported since the last meeting was made by the Secretary as per the attached listing.

The Secretary advised that twenty-eight (28) applications for retirement were submitted to the office for presentation at this meeting. One application for Total and Permanent Disability Retirement for Jethro Bright, Badge No. 11744, was submitted by the Transportation Department with a request to be made retroactive to June 1, 1967. After general discussion by the Committee and a motion by Mr. Keiser, seconded by Mr. Flaherty, the Committee unanimously approved twenty-eight (28) applications recommended by the Secretary.

The Secretary advised that one application was received from the Transportation Department for Total and Permanent Disability Retirement, which was not submitted at this time. This application was for Isaac Woods, Operator No. 1172, 77th Street. Mr. Woods has been absent from duty since March 7, 1967 and has been found unfit for work as a Bus Operator. However, he was approved for such non-operating work as Janitor, Porter, or Ticket Agent. This employe was interviewed by the Employment Department for consideration for one of these non-operating jobs. The Employment Department advised by letter that on August 30, 1967, Mr. Woods declined consideration for a current job vacancy.

The Secretary reported that during the month, eight (8) employes on Total and Permanent Disability Retirement, as per the attached listing, were examined by the Medical Department or their records reviewed.
