The 252nd Meeting of the Retirement Allowance Committee was held on May 18, 1970 in the Secretary's Office, Room 746, in the Merchandise Mart, and the following were in attendance:

The Secretary called the Meeting to order at 10:40 A.M.

The Secretary advised that in the absence of the Chairman, a Chairman Pro Tempore must be elected. Mr. Hastings made a motion, econded by Mr. Murray, that Mr. Scholl be elected Chairman Pro Tempore. There being no further nominations, the Committee unanimously elected Mr. Scholl as Chairman Pro Tempore.

On a motion by Mr. Hastings, seconded by Mr. Loughran, the minutes of the 251st Meeting held on April 20, 1970, were unanimously approved.

On a motion by Mr. Murray, seconded by Mr. Kohler, the Committee unanimously approved the twenty-six (26) applications submitted by the Secretary. One of the applications submitted for Regular Retirement, retroactive to May 1, 1970, was for Robert Johnson, who furnished the Secretary's Office with documentary proof indicating his year of birth

as one year earlier than the date on file. Mr. Johnson has not worked since April 30, 1970, and therefore his retirement should be retroactive to May 1, 1970. On a motion by Mr. Kohler, seconded by Mr. Loughran, the Committee unanimously approved application for Mr. Johnson be made retroactive to May 1, 1970.

The Secretary reported that during the month, ten (10) employes on Total and Permanent Disability Retirement were examined by the Medical Department or their records reviewed.

On a motion by Mr. Murray, seconded by Mr. Riley, the refunds numbering 44 and totaling \$82,044.60 to be made May 31, 1970, as per the attached report, were unanimously approved.

The Secretary read a report of deposits, disbursements and investments during the month of April as per the attached report.

The Secretary presented Chicago Transit Authority bills totaling \$5,436.02 and miscellaneous bills totaling \$16,257.38 for approval. On a motion by Mr. Murray, seconded by Mr. Kohler, the Committee unanimously approved payment of these bills.
