For the benefit of the new member of the Committee, Mr. Manning, the minutes of the first meeting were explained. It was agreed by the Committee that each of the ten Unions represented by Mr. Manning should receive a copy of the minutes of future Committee meetings and that Mr. Manning should also receive a copy of the minutes of the last meeting.

> the meeting of August 15, 1941, a new resolution was submitted at this meeting and signed in duplicate by those present. The old resolution was then destroyed in the presence of the members.

Temporary Employe Census Card Form

The Temporary Employe Census Card form, containing the waiver of benefits under the Chicago Surface Lines Employes' Retirement Plan, as suggested in the last meeting, was read to the Committee by Mr. Storm. Mr. Shaughnessy moved, seconded by Mr. Sterling, that the form be accepted and sent to the printers, which was unanimously approved by the Committee.

Retirement Mr. Storm suggested that the set of forms now being used in Forms connection with the retirement applications be used for a time in order to determine what changes should be made before they are sent to the printers, to which the Committee agreed.

Proofs of Age

A list of various proofs of age, which had been used by the Equitable Life Assurance Society for the Standard Oil Company, was read to the Committee by the Secretary and it was decided that the list should be adopted for use under the Surface Lines Employes' Retirement Plan and copies sent to all Department Heads.

Refunds

The following question was presented to the Committee by the Secretary: Should refunds be made to those employes who have left the Company since June 1, 1941? Mr. Manning suggested that no refunds be made to those employes leaving the service to date, because of the small amount involved. accept where specific application is made, but that refunds should be made automatically in the future, which suggestion was unanimously agreed to by the Committee. Mr. Storm then proposed that the Company pay the refunds at the time the employes receive their last salary check and then receive reimbursement periodically from the Trustee. This procedure to be used in order to save the Trustee the trouble of issuing a number of checks of very small denomination. Mr. Storm felt that the Trustee would raise no objection but would. in fact, welcome such a proposal.

CSL Contribution to Fund A Chicago Surface Lines voucher in the amount of \$44,500.00, covering the Company's contribution to the Fund, was turned over to the Chairman by the Secretary and subsequently ap-

proved by the Committee for deposit on account with the Trustee.
