

CHICAGO SURFACE LINES EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT PLAN

The 10th meeting of the Retirement Allowance Committee of the Chicago surface Lines Employes' Retirement Plan was held on Monday, March 16, 1942, at 2:00 P.M., in the Board Room, Room 1487, 231 S. duty Mr. Storm reported that Charles Hochstadt, whose application for re-instatement to active duty was approved by the Committee at the last meeting, was examined by the Company doctors on March 7, 1942 and found fit to return to his former occupation. A total amount of \$240.00 has been paid to him from the Retirement Allowance Fund.

Employe The following question was brought up by Mr. Hall: If an employe is discharged or resigns and one-half of his contribution to the Fund is refunded to him and he is subsequently re-instated, what action should be taken? It was decided, after some discussion, that an employe who is re-instated must reimburse the Fund for the amount returned to him. The Committee suggested that the Secretary write to the Company Auditor of the decision made and also notify him that the method of reimbursement was left to his discretion.

The question of whether a retired employe returning to active work with the Company should pay back to the Fund all of the money paid him during his period of retirement was left with the Secretary in order that he may question the Legal Department of the Company and report back on same at the next meeting.

Mr. Gill stated that Mr. Jack Woods, Editor of the Union Leader, had made a request that a copy of the minutes of the Committee meetings be mailed to him for his records. Request was granted by the Committee.

There was considerable discussion as to whether John J. Glynn, Badge No. 3248, North Avenue, who made application for retirement at this meeting, had reached 65 years of age. All of the Company records and Division 241 records showed him to be under 65 years of age, however, a baptismal certificate, received from Ireland, showed him to be 66 years of age. The baptismal certificate showed a distinct erasure on the last digit and it was the opinion of the Committee that this had previously been a seven, which would make him 65 on June 27, 1942. Mr. Sullivan recommended withholding action until the meeting in May, 1942. Mr. Gill recommended he be approved as of June 1, 1942. Mr. Storm recommended accepting his application as of June 27, 1942, because of

the change on the baptismal certificate from 1877 to 1876,
and approve for July 1, 1942.
