New Applications

The following regular retirement applications were presented to the Committee at this meeting:

Sixty from the Transportation Department, five from the Shops and Equipment Department, three from the Track Department, two from the Utility Department, and one from the Electrical Department. Mr. Storm informed the Committee that Edward F. Stanton, Michael Cooney, Paul F. Heidenreich, and Floyd C. Turkington all four of whom have been granted Total and Permanent Disability became age 65 in the month of August-1949 and would be transferred to the regular Retirement Roll effective September 1, 1949. Mr. Bedore made a motion, seconded by Mr. Devane, that the 71 applications be approved. Motion passed. This makes a total of 2,451 applications approved to date.

The Total and Permanent Disability application of Evert Erickson of the Transportation Department was also presented. Mr. Bedore made a motion, seconded by Mr. Bernard, that this application be approved. Motion passed. This makes a total of 164 applications approved to date.

Returned to Total and Permanent Disability

Mr. Storm read a letter received from Mr. Hall which stated that Frank Polich who was granted Total and Permanent Disability effective March 1, 1949 and returned to work as a Flagman on April 15, 1949 would go back on Total and Permanent Disability effective September 1, 1949.

Mr. Forsythe stated that the next meeting of the Retirement Allowance Committee would be held on September 19, 1949.
